Q: How long have you been lobstering?

A: For five years.

Q: What other members of your family lobster?

A: My uncles, brother, and father.

Q: Who do you go lobstering with?

A: My older brother, Philip.

Q: Have often do you go in a week?

A: Every day that you can.

Q: How often do you go in a year?

A: All of the summer months and on Saturdays.

Q: Do you have a license?

A: I had to go to the town office and buy it.

Q: Where do you fish?

A: The river, Friendship Long Island, Hall Island, Franklin Island, Egg Rock, and a few other places.

Q: How far out do you fish?

A: Past Egg Rock.

Q: How deep do you fish?

A: Thirty-five fathoms of water.

Q: How do you know where to set your traps?

A: A color machine and a flasher.

Q: When does your day begin?

A: About 3:30 in the morning.

Q: When does it end?

A: At about 11:30-12:00.

Q: What is your job on the boat?

A: I am a sternman.

Q: Describe your job.

A: I put the bait on the traps, fill the bait bags, band and measure the lobsters.

Q: Describe how to haul a trap.

A: You haul it up with the hauler; you put it on the washboard; you take the lobsters out of the trap and everything else in there. Your sternman puts the bait on it, closes it up, and throws it in the water.

Q: How much rope do you attach?

A: It depends on where you set the trap.

Q: What color is your pot buoy?

A: Orange on top and purple on the bottom.

Q: What do you use for bait?

A: I put herring in the bait bag and pogies on top.

Q: Where do you get it?

A: The bait truck.

Q: How many traps do you haul in a day?

A: One hundred and fifty to 200.

Q: What is the normal catch for a day?

A: Usually about 250 pounds.

Q: What is the biggest lobster that you have ever caught?

A: It was so big that I don't know how he got in the trap!

Q: How much did it weigh?

A: Fifty to 60 pounds.

Q: How do you keep from getting bit by the lobster?

A: You grab it by the lobster's knuckles so he can't bite you.

Q: Why do some lobsters have v-notches in their tails?

A: Because they are mothers, but sometimes they don't have eggs.

Q: What happens if you get caught with a short or a v-notched lobster?

A: The first time you get caught you get a fine, and the second time you most likely lose your license.

Q: What other kinds of fish do you catch in your traps?

A: Flatfish, horn pout, sculpin, dogfish, codfish, stripers, and mackerel.

Q: What is your favorite fish?

A: My favorite fish is codfish.

Q: What is your least favorite fish?

A: My least favorite is horn pout.

Q: What other kinds of sea life do you encounter when you are out on the water?

A: All kinds of different things, like crabs.

Q: Where do you sell your lobsters?

A: To the lobster truck.

Q: Describe your lobster boat.

A: It is 32 feet long, it's name is the *M/Crack/In*, and it has a 360-Chrysler.

Q: Why is it named that?

A: It is my brother's nickname.

Q: What do you do if you have to go to the bathroom on the boat?

A: We go in a bucket or over the stern.

Q: What do you wear when you go lobstering?

A: Oil pants and an oil shirt when it's raining.

Q: Describe the parts of a lobster trap.

A: It's like a big box; it has heads and one string called the bait line that you put the bait bag with the bait in it on.

Q: Do you ever use toggles?

A: Yes.

Q: Describe what a toggle is.

A: It holds the rope up off the bottom so you don't get a hung down trap.

Q: Have you ever fallen overboard?

A: No

Q: Have you ever gotten seasick?

A: Once when I was small.

Q: Has your boat ever broken down?

A: Yes. It breaks down quite a bit.

Q: Have you ever lost traps or bait bags over board?

A: Yes, all the time.

Q: What is the most scary thing that has ever happened to you?

A: Nothing that scary.

Q: What do you like most on the boat?

A: Catching lobsters and making money.

Q: What do you like least about lobstering?

A: The work.

Q: Do you like to eat lobster?

A: Yes.

Q: How often do you eat it?

A: Not very often.

Q: How do you like it cooked?

A: Boiled.
