Then they start having people come from outside, the Cossack people, and the fishermens watched the fish and they were so sad, and they, can't fish for ourselves only after we be done, but the fishermen they used to get sifh from their nets and they bring them home and everyone want to take them. And then after that they quit fishing, I mean, everybody got fish, they didn't want to fish. We take them, tell them go get the fish cux we couldn't go fishing, so we bring them across to, I had camp across there, I cut them.

My smokehouse full, they help me. Even my girls, they were so lazy to cut, I tell them to help me so we can finish them while it's good weather.
