## **Interview of Joanne and Robert Simpson**

## November, 2002

**Interviewer: Richard Anthes** 

Anthes: This is Rick Anthes, with Bob and Joanne Simpson on the 27<sup>th</sup> of

November, 2002. We are going to be looking at some photographs in preparation for my talk at the AMS and symposium. We will start with for example Bob, and do a decade or so on Bob, and then switch to Joanne, and do a decade or so on Joanne, and then fold it in so that you come in and you merge together at the appropriate time in your lives when you got married. So it will be a little bit of Bob, a little bit of Joanne, a little bit of Bob, and then Bob and Joanne together, and it will bring us

right up to the present. So, lets just let this thing run here.

J Simpson: Never mind those honey, I will pick them up. You talk about your

childhood, and show them this book you got on his 90<sup>th</sup> birthday, which

shows wonderful pictures of...

Anthes: This one, yeah this is the one.

R. Simpson: We will have to go back farther you know than this.

J Simpson: There are some baby pictures of you somewhere, I was going through

them yesterday.

R. Simpson: Yeah, you brought them out here, and I have not gone through them as t

they are.

J. Simpson: Well, let me try and find them while you are talking.

Anthes: So this is your birthday album is that right?

J. Simpson: Yeah, that was his 90th birthday, it was just a week ago. There is some

R. Simpson: It was a week ago Saturday. We had about 30 people over at house.

J. Simpson: I think that the best baby pictures of you are in there.

R. Simpson: Are they, well okay I will just thumb through these things here. I have a

bunch of letters to go over from people I know.

Anthes: Uh huh.

R. Simpson: And some, that is baby pictures I guess.

Anthes: Okay.

R. Simpson: They are ages old. That is when I I guess.

Anthes: That is quite good actually. Where is this? The one with the fish?

R. Simpson: That was where we were in Corpus Christi. I caught a big red fish out

fishing with my dad at \_\_\_\_\_ Bluff, where the naval air station is right now. That was probably back around 1923 or 1924, something like that.

Anthes: It looks like you were about maybe 11-years-old, or 12-years-old there?

R. Simpson: I would guess so, well let's see. It was 1919, it was the 1919 hurricane,

which was the biggy in my life. I think we probably had been there about

two or three years, and I was born in 1912.

Anthes: That would be a nice one to copy when we talk.

R. Simpson: My daughter has made up this volume here.

Anthes: Famous pictures.

R. Simpson: We have some more to go in it. Yes, we have not got it all cut down yet.

Anthes: Allen Pearson, he was the head of the severe storm tracking for a while.

R. Simpson: Yes, that is right. That was the one that actually brought him in. He

worked in \_\_\_\_\_\_, I taught him out there at the Weather Bureau when I was out there in charge. Then I brought him to Washington, and he got into severe storm work there. He never worked with severe storms and did not know anything about them, but he was the type of guy that comes trotting in and learns what he needs to learn to do the job. Then \_\_\_\_\_ the cells

R. Simpson	: I was concerned in the depression, everybody's attitude, I never felt any difficulties from it, just being lucky to have a job, the only job that I could get was a grocery store.

R. Simpson	: (Laugh) I had one to, in the contest, solo contest two years in a row, and the guy that was a judge there, did not have a job, no place to go. He wanted to come up here and play in my band and orchestra, and, and that is how I got started. That led into a career in music for a little while. I managed to take over the orchestra and band myself back in the later part of the depression when the guy who was head of it left because he found a job, which later went broke.

R. Simpson	But he left, and they could not find anybody else to take it over, so this guy recommended that he put it in my hands, and later find a qualified person. So I held it for the rest of the time that I was at South Western, and including one year graduate work that I did there, both band and, all of the instrumental music.

Anthes: Uh huh.
R. Simpson: We had like 30 people at this party.
J. Simpson: I think that is my 70th birthday, so it was either that or my 20th anniversary.

Anthes: So a group picture here?

J. Simpson: Yeah, and that is Bob, and that is his older daughter, that is my oldest son, and that is my younger son, that is his wife there, that is my son-in-law, and there is my little Karen just ready to give birth. Anthes: Is this your daughter? J. Simpson: Yes, that is my youngest daughter. Anthes: Yeah, okay. J. Simpson: And that is Lynn. Anthes: Oh yeah? J. Simpson: So that is the whole bunch. Anthes: Oh yeah, so that is the whole family, great. R. Simpson: This is when I just got back from my youngest , I was the last one of eight I think. He, I had no way of getting into college, but he found a job working at a college, at the University of Texas in San Antonio, and he made his own way through college little by little, I think that it took him, I think he became a specialist, \_\_\_\_\_, he is an orthopedic surgeon, his wife is a very special kind of a nurse. Anthes: Okay. So that . . J. Simpson: They went to \_\_\_\_\_. Anthes: Let's put this on the side. There are several pictures in there I would like to copy.

Anthes: Oh yeah, we looked at the \_\_\_\_\_.

J. Simpson: You want to show your Western yearbook.


R. Simpson: Oh yeah.

R. Simpson: Okay, fine.

Anthes: Let me just check and see how this tape is doing. I do not know if it warns me when it is done or not. Oh, it is still going, so.

R. Simpson: I am not sure if this could be copied very well, but this is South Western there, my trumpet, shortly after I took over the band and orchestra, and this was in the next one, this. That is part of our band.
Anthes: Oh cool Band, official South Western University Band, boy, everybody is all dressed up, black tie, you had
R. Simpson: Whenever they performed, they performed in tuxes.
Anthes: Yeah, which one are you?
R. Simpson: That is a concert band there.
Anthes: Yeah, okay, right, well.
R. Simpson: And a
Anthes: Okay, so you are the one that is describing there, so if I copy this I will know, huh? Okay, you are the second standing up in the back.
R. Simpson: Yeah, after the tuba.
Anthes: Okay.
R. Simpson: And this is a little orchestra that we had. It played everything from concert music to dance music, and went around to alumni clubs across the state concert, or
Anthes: Okay, did you charge for that? Is that how you raised funds for your?
R. Simpson: No. This is university recruiting students.
Anthes: Okay, I see, you were recruiting.
R. Simpson: (Laugh)
Anthes: Okay. We can copy those. I know that my secretary has a very good scanner that will copy anything.
R. Simpson: Yeah, oh that is great.
Anthes: But a, I will have to take these back with me.
R. Simpson: Uh, to carry on the continuity there, I, you can see both of my activities were in music while I was in college, but I never studied music in college, I studied physics and mathematics all through my , well except for

	Chicago when you are already there, but after I got out, I got my masters at University, that was South Western University there.
Anthes: Uh hu	ah, uh huh.
R. Simpson: Y	You know Austin, Texas and Georgetown, Texas, and I went from South Western to Emery, again. I did not have any money. One of my good friends who graduated a year ahead of me in South Western went to Emery, I do not know where he got his money either, it was still in the depression years. His father was a minister. Not much money. Anyway, and he went over to Emery, he said it is a great school over here, you ought to come over here and do your graduate work here. I said on what? I do not even have enough money to buy a bus ticket to cross there.
Anthes: Oh m	y gosh.
R. Simpson: S	to, he said I think that I can get you a scholarship over here in music. No reason why not. I said okay, tell me more. So he wrote back about a week later and said yeah you have a scholarship in music over here. I said how much? He said it will be half of your tuition.
Anthes: (Laug	ch)
R. Simpson: 1	do not know what I was going to do for the other half. (Laugh)
Anthes: Yeah.	
R. Simpson: S	to then he got me a second scholarship in physics over there. So with those two, I had enough to pay my way, all the way through.
Anthes: Uh hu	ıh.
R. Simpson: A	All the way through, so I went over there and did my masters work there in physics, and I was assistant director of the little symphony orchestra over there, so, and I sang with the Glee Club, and we traveled all over the United States, but that was a rather famous Glee Club at that time.
Anthes: Wow.	
R. Simpson: T	They traveled to Europe every other year sponsored by an woman from Brittain, I cannot recall her name now.
Anthes: An in	famous woman from Brittain? (Laugh)



Anthes: I imagine.

R. Simpson:	First year. Well, five years I had to feed my mouth with directing bands. I ended up in Corpus Christi in charge of music Corpus Christi, and by just chance and good luck being at the right place at the right time, why I made in that position more money per year than the principle in the high school did.
Anthes: Oh, 1	see.
R. Simpson:	In fact, the football coach, and the made more money (laugh) strange.
Anthes: That	is kind of how priorities continue today.
R. Simpson:	But, it turned out that it was an unhappy experience. Well, we did pretty well. I was really proud with what we did, but as a profession, that is not the way that I wanted to go. I had to stop and go back to the conservatory and everything, and keep up with everything. I didn't want to do that. I didn't want to learn all that I wanted to learn in physics and mathematics to the, so I said that I was going to get out. I started taking examinations, and the Weather Bureau was the first one to offer me a job, there were two jobs, Abilene or in Brownsville. I took the one in Brownsville.
Anthes: You	knew that you were interested in meteorology and weather at that time.
R. Simpson: `	Well, I had always intended to be in meteorology one way or the other, because a very close friend of mine, his father was head of the Weather Bureau in Corpus Christi, and I knew that family pretty well. And, he was pretty well known. He published a lot of papers. He had practically a paper in every month that the weather paper came out.
Anthes: Wha	t was his name?
R. Simpson:	J.P He, his son and I went to South Western at the same time, we graduated together.
Anthes: Is tha	at right?
R. Simpson:	But anyway, that is more a big deal than it is important. But anyway, uh, I was sent to Brownsville, and a long story there. I was not very happy there either because they had five people in the station there. The man that was in charge had been in 25 years. He won maybe \$2000.00 per year. I had been making \$4500.00 teaching music.

Anthes: Oh that is right. I remember from your interview that you 50% pay cut of something.	or
R. Simpson: I was not worried about that. Not along this time as far as the money was concerned. I wanted to have a way to go up. The youngest man at the station there had been there for three years, and he was still in the lowest grade pay in the Weather Bureau, and he was not even thinking about a promotion. So I, I uh, had a chance to talk to one of the head guys from Washington, he was assistant chief at that time, and he was Lloyd. He came down to Brownsville,, and the result why, knowing that he was coming, I called Washington, and I asked if I could talk to him for a few minutes while he was down. He gave me an appointment to see him in his hotel alone.	
Anthes: Uh huh.	
R. Simpson: And I told him that I would like to go ahead in the Weather Bureau, but I d not see anyway of progressing in that, and I had to get out and go some place where I could get ahead. So he said, well it just so happens that I need someone, to take care of the observation down there. I promise you if you go down there, I would bet everybody would want to go there. You go down there and take care of that job for six months, an I would see that you get sent back to	١
Anthes: You mean the town down in the Caribbean?	
R. Simpson: Yes, about 300 miles South of Havana. I did, and trouble was he was in Central Office by the time that we came back.	
Anthes: You mean everything.	
R. Simpson: It is a long story, but anyway, I was taken back to New Orleans, made good good on a promise, and I went on from there. The rest of my care I was in the Weather Bureau, and I retired from there.
